

How You Can Support Your Child Whilst They Are At Home

Ninestiles An Academy will close on Friday until further notice to help fight the spread of Coronavirus. We will remain open to support key worker families and vulnerable children, provision for this will be outlined as soon as possible to parents. During our closure we will be operating an online curriculum and would like to support you in how you might create the right conditions for learning at home.

Top 5 tips for securing daily routine is really important.

1. Try to make sure that your child gets up at their usual time and follows their daily timetable
2. Wherever possible your child should give full attention their work and should work free from distractions. A quiet study area with a desk is ideal.
3. We appreciate that they may need to use their mobile phone to access work that has been set online but it is advised that you monitor this so that they are not being distracted
4. Students should use their existing timetable to plan their work each day. It's expected that student will complete 4 lessons per day and spending around 75 minutes on each task.
5. Students in Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9 will we able to complete 4 hours of learning per day using online resources. Students in Year 10 and Year 11 should aim to complete 6 hours of learning per day using online resources plus homework.

Online Curriculum Access

Subject	Instructions: All students should follow their normal timetable and are expected to complete 4 x 75minute lessons per day. Any student without internet access can request hardcopies of the work outlined.
Maths	KS3: Lessons will be updated on Hegarty Maths in advance weekly. (Textbooks have been issued for those without internet access) KS4: Students have access to Hegarty GCSE questions and in year 11 students have past paper questions in examination packs
English	KS3: Daily writing and Mastery already uploaded onto Sharepoint (Year 7 Midsummer Nights Dream, Year 8 Tempest, Year 9 non fiction with clear view point) KS4: students have Past papers, knowledge organisers and knowledge quiz papers all printed to complete and all have work set on GCSE Pod
Science	KS3: Daily upload of lessons onto sharepoint (Years 7 & 8) KS4: Years 9 & 10 work will be uploaded daily onto sharepoint. Year 11 PIXL packs on sharepoint along with revision work from exam pack.
Art & Design Technology, Food	KS3: Must complete all 4 lesson uploaded onto share point (Include Art, DT and Food) KS4: Year 10 complete the mini projects set in Art, DT or Photography. Year 11 complete independent learning packs received as hardcopies or on sharepoint.
Geography	KS3: Weekly uploads onto Sharepoint through until Easter KS4: Year 10 Revision work available through GCSE Pod. Year 11 students issued with revision packs and past papers.
History	KS3: Work uploaded to Sharepoint , specific lessons are set daily for students. KS4: Work will be uploaded daily, students in year 11 will be issued with examination papers to sit alongside this.
IT	KS3: All work has been uploaded onto sharepoint KS4: All assignments on sharepoint – (much of this work will require students to have access to IT equipment)
Inclusion	All homework and literacy packs will be uploaded onto share point for students to access
MFL	KS3: All lessons will be uploaded onto sharepoint weekly in advance. Students have vocabulary booklets to revise from and are able to practise daily. Students should also login to Linguascope KS4: All year lessons will be uploaded onto sharepoint weekly. Year 11 have had past papers and revision packs printed and distributed
HAL/Sports studies	KS3: Students select from a choice of lessons on Physical, mental and social wellbeing. KS4: Core lessons focus on physical, mental and social well being and are uploaded on sharepoint. Sports studies students have revision guides and will be able to access coursework online.
Religious Studies	KS3: All lessons have been uploaded onto Sharepoint until Easter students are expected to complete 1 lesson per week KS4: Students to in year 10 complete all 4 topic areas (crime and punishment, religion and life, relationships, peace and conflict). Students in Year 11 to complete last topics on Buddhism practices. Year 11 have access to a revision pack and past papers.
